BACKGROUND: Section 29-1-103 of the Colorado Revised Statutes provides, in part, the following:						

- (1) Each local government shall adopt an annual budget. To the extent that the financial activities of any local government are fully reported in the budget or budgets of a parent local government or governments, a separate budget is not required. Such budget shall present a complete financial plan by fund and by spending agency within each fund for the budget year and shall set forth the following:
 - (a) All proposed expenditures for administration, operations, maintenance, debt service, and capital projects to be undertaken or executed by any spending agency during the budget year;
 - (b) Anticipated revenues for the budget year;
 - (c) Estimated beginning and ending fund balance.

In order to be in compliance with state budget laws, the City Treasurer is presenting a resolution to appropriate sums of money expected from collection of property taxes by the Prowers County Treasurer.

Mayor Crespin did ask if this would be all of the bottles and it was stated yes. However, in the motion to approve the modification it was not stated that they were approving contingent on Wal-Mart utilizing the safety caps. City Clerk Williams stated that none of the other locations that have been approved since then have any type of safety caps being utilized nor was it brought up in any of their approvals. At this time, she requested direction from Council on how they would like to proceed with this.

Mayor Crespin stated that he did reach out to the manager of Wal-Mart regarding this issue and believed there was a spokesperson in the audience to speak on this.

Ms. Stonerock reported that they do have additional caps on order if they are needed. The home office stated that they wanted the caps on any bottles over \$30.00.

All councilmembers commented and are in agreement that not all entities were asked to provide safety caps on their product so they will not insist on Wal-Mart putting the safety caps on all of their wine bottles.

Ports to Plains Update - Beverly Haggard

Ports to Plains Liaison Beverly Haggard gave an update from the Ports to Plains conference held in Eagle Pass, TX Sept 12-14, 2023. She reported that there were 165 attendees with 30 speakers and about 30 sponsors for the conference. She stated that they are currently working on the land ports, which there are three, Eagle Pass, Laredo, and Del Rio. All three are expanding; with this there will be more truck traffic. This is why we need to keep pushing the future interstate. Colorado's Governor just appointed five individuals to the transportation board who had no transportation experience. We need to educate them to what is in this area. We have the interstate designated as I27. She state that the top five exports from Colorado to Texas are mixed freight, meat & seafood, machinery, motorized vehicles and electronics. In one year just the meat & seafood alone is \$596,000,000.00 just to Texas. The exports to Mexico are motorized vehicles at \$1,626,000,000.00, mixed freight \$1,418,000,000.00, machinery \$457,000,000.00, coal \$211,000,000.00 and other food items is \$190,000,000.00. It would be nice to have the opportunity to get some of these businesses here. This is the importance of designating this interstate. They are working on getting Oklahoma on board. They did say that if Colorado designated the future interstate, they would as well.

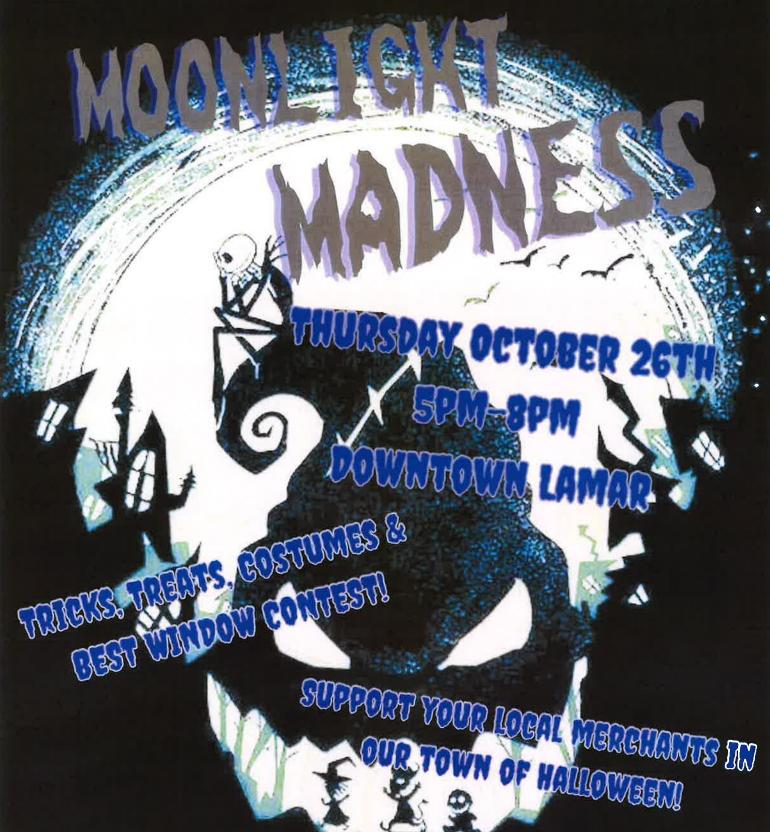

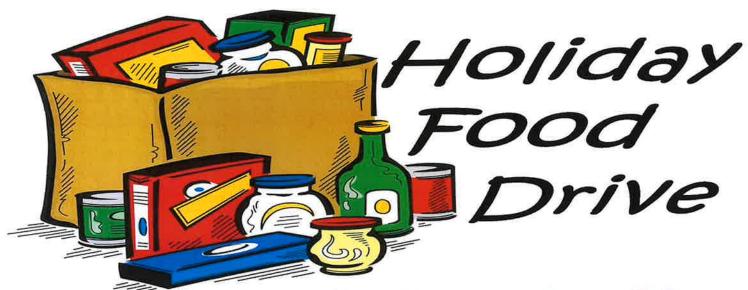

ACTION PROPOSED: Have the ordinance read, approve it on second reading, and order it published
STAFF INFORMATION SOURCE: City Treasurer
BACKGROUND: Pursuant to Section 5-1 of the Lamar City Charter, we hereby submit a proposed ordinance to set the annual mill levy.
Staff recommends that the mill levy be set at 13.239 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessmen of all taxable property within the City for the year 2024.
If approved this will be the 36th consecutive year that the City has operated without a property tax mill levy increase.
With a mill levy of 13.239 mills, the City will collect \$497,043 in 2024. This represents an increase of approximately 3% from \$484,430 in 2023.
At the October 9, 2023 City Council meeting, City Council voted 7-0 to pass the ordinance on first reading.
RECOMMENDATION: Pass the ordinance on second reading.

COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN

PROWERS COUNTY DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES AND PROWERS COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT

This Agreement is entered into the ______ day of <u>October, 2023</u> by and between the **Prowers County**Department of Human Services (Hereinafter referred as "Human Services") and the Lamar Police Department,

Granada Police Department, and the Prowers County Sheriff's Office (Hereinafter "Law Enforcement").

WHEREAS, abuse and neglect are community problems requiring cooperation and complementary responses by law enforcement and child protection agencies to protect endangered children; and

WHEREAS, C.R.S. §19-3-304 and §19-3-307 require that incidents of known or suspected child abuse or neglect be reported to the Human Services or local Law Enforcement Agency; and

WHEREAS, referrals and cooperation between Law Enforcement Agency and Human Services are necessary to assure prompt action, protection of the child, and actions as required by law; and

WHEREAS, CRS §19-3-308(5.5) declares that the State legislature intends that county departments of human services enter into cooperative agreements with law enforcement agencies to coordinate the duties of each agency in connection with the investigation of all child abuse or neglect cases.

NOW, THEREFORE, the agencies herein agree as follows:

- 1. Human Services will notify the appropriate Law Enforcement Agency of reports of known or suspected child abuse or neglect, and provide copies of the report to the respective Law Enforcement Agencies, as required by C.R.S. §19-3-307(3).
- 2. Law Enforcement Agencies will notify the Child Protection Services Unit of the Prowers County Department of Human Services of any report of known or suspected child abuse or neglect received by such Law Enforcement Agencies. Such notice will be provided even where the Law Enforcement Agency will be the only entity conducting an investigation. When appropriate Law Enforcement shall conduct the initial investigation and will have the necessary training to complete the assessment of child well-being.
- 3. If the incident involves the death of a child, Law Enforcement Agencies shall notify Human Services.
- 4. Once each appropriate Law Enforcement Agency and the Child Protection Services Unit of Human Services have been notified of a particular case of known or suspected child abuse or neglect, the methods of investigation and the priority of the case shall be mutually determined on a case-by-case basis. Joint investigations shall be conducted to the extent possible and deemed appropriate. Human Services shall coordinate the investigations of all incidents of known or suspected (intrafamilial child abuse) and institutional abuse.

- Cases deemed appropriate for joint investigation between the Child Protection Services "CPS" Unit of Human Services and the Law Enforcement Agency shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. Death of a child when there are surviving siblings in family;
 - b. Moderate to severe physical abuse or the risk thereof; see appendix B
 - c. Familial and quasi-familial sexual abuse (by parents, guardian, stepparent, boyfriend, girlfriend, and other persons who reside in the child's home);
 - d. Severe environmental neglect;
 - e. Possibility of need for placement or protective custody; see appendix C
 - f. Suspected danger to investigators from threatening, belligerent parent;
 - g. No familial sexual abuse when alleged perpetrator has children under 18 or there are protective issues for suspected victims;
 - h. When it appears that the suspected perpetrator may flee;
 - i. When parent refuses access to the children by CPS or refuses medical examination of the children;
 - j. Physical or sexual abuse In institutional settings such as a foster home, group home, day care home, residential child care facility or institution;
 - k. Conditions suggesting the need for an arrest or the issuance of a child abuse or neglect summons and complaint; see appendix D
 - I. Drug exposed babies; or,
 - m. Any case in which, in the presence of a child, or on the premises where a child is found, or where a child resides, a controlled substance, is <u>illegally</u> manufactured or <u>distributed</u> or attempted to be manufactured or <u>distributed</u>.
- 6. Cases deemed appropriate for investigation solely by the Child Protection Services Unit of Human Services shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. Mild physical abuse;
 - b. Fetal Alcohol Syndrome;
 - Non-Organic Failure to Thrive;
 - d. Medical neglect (including failure to provide medically indicated treatment to disabled infants with life threatening conditions);
 - e. Third party abuse or neglect when alleged perpetrator under age 10;
 - f. Educational neglect;
 - g. Emotional abuse; or,
 - h. Mild and moderate neglect, lack of supervision.

- 7. Cases deemed appropriate for investigation solely by law enforcement shall include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - a. Third party abuse or neglect when alleged perpetrator over age 10. Third party abuse includes, but is not limited to babysitters, nannies, teachers, school personnel, neighbors, etc.;
 - b. Death of a child with no surviving siblings; or,
 - c. Report of Immediate danger to a child when proximity and speed of law enforcement response is needed, when Child Protective Services Unit of Human Services is not available and risk to the child indicates immediate evaluation is needed (after hours, welfare check).
- 8. When requested by Law Enforcement Agency in third party abuse or neglect cases, Human Services may assist in interviewing victims under age 6, or older children with special needs.
- 9. Human Services shall be responsible for ensuring that all parents and families from whom children are removed under court order or by Law Enforcement Agency personnel are provided with a copy of The Notice of Rights and Remedies at the time of the child's removal.
- 10. To ensure admissibility of evidence in criminal cases based on joint investigations for severe child abuse and fatalities, Law Enforcement will be responsible for interviews of suspected perpetrators.
- 11. This agreement shall remain in effect for 4 years. The parties of the agreement shall begin to review and initiate a renewal agreement (in writing and in person meetings) no longer than 6 months prior to the expiration of the agreement.
- 11. Any party wishing to terminate this agreement shall do so in writing to all parties with a thirty (30) day notice.

Definitions:

1. Intrafamilial abuse means any case of abuse that occurs within a family context by a child's parent, step-parent, guardian, legal custodian, or relative, by a spousal equivalent or by any other person who resides in the child's home or who is regularly in the child's home for the purpose of exercising authority over or care for the child; except that "intrafamilial abuse" shall not include abuse by a person who is paid for rendering care and is not related to the child.

Appendix A

CRITERIA FOR MODERATE TO SEVERE PHYSCIAL ABUSE

The following conditions describe moderate to severe physical abuse. Joint investigation by CPS and law enforcement is recommended in intrafamilial and institutional abuse cases to evaluate the need for immediate medical evaluation, protective custody of the child, and appropriate civil and criminal action. Other criteria also require joint investigation.

- All head trauma injuries (i.e., subdural hematoma)
- All injuries involving ruptured organs, unexplained abdominal injury, or other injuries consistent with abuse.
- All fractures which are unexplained, multiple, or in various stages of healing, or where the reason given for the fracture is inconsistent with the injury.
- All second or third degree burns, cigarette burns, or other burns consistent with abuse.
- All lacerations to the face, external genitalia, or extremities which are unexplained or where the reason given is inconsistent with the nature of the incident.
- All skin bruising or lesions on different parts of the body.

Appendix B

SITUATIONS SUGGESTING THE NEED FOR PROTECTIVE CUSTODY

The following situations suggest the need for protective custody pursuant to a court order, or if there is not time to obtain one, or an emergency basis by a law enforcement officer, pursuant to C.R.S. 19-3-401,402,and 403. However, the decision to remove a child has a second part; can the need to place a child in protective custody be obviated by the parent's incarceration or by the provision of appropriate services by the child protective agency or other agencies?

- The child was severely assaulted, that is, hit, poisoned, or burned so severely that serious injury resulted or could have resulted (For example, the parent threw an infant against a wall, but the infant was not seriously injured).
- The child has been systematically tortured or inhumanely punished. (For example, the child was locked in a closet for long periods, forced to eat unpalatable substances, or forced to squat, stand or perform other unreasonable acts for a long time).
- The parent's reckless disregard for the child's safety caused serious injury or could have done so. (For example, the parent left a young child in the care of an obviously irresponsible or dangerous individual).
- The physical condition of the home is so dangerous that it poses an immediate threat of serious injury. (For example, exposed electrical wiring or other materials create an extreme danger of fire).
- The child has been sexually abused or sexually exploited.
- The parents have purposefully or systematically withheld essential food for extended periods as a form of punishment for real or imagined misbehavior.
- The parents refuse to obtain or to consent to medical or psychiatric care for the child that is needed immediately to prevent or treat a serious injury or disease. (For example, the child's physical condition shows signs of severe deterioration to which the parents seem unwilling or unable to respond).
- The parents appear to be suffering from mental illness, mental retardation, drug abuse, or alcohol abuse so severe that they cannot provide for the child's basic needs. (For example, the parents are demonstrably out of touch with reality).
- The parents have abandoned the child. (For instance, the child has been left in the custody of persons who have not agreed to care for the child for more than a few hours and who do not know how to reach the parents).
- There is reason to suspect that the parents may flee with the child. (For example, the parents have a history of frequent moves or hiding the child from outsiders).

- There is specific evidence that the parent's anger and discomfort about the report and the subsequent investigation will result in retaliation against the child. (Such information could be gained through a review of the parent's past behaviors during the investigation interview or reports from others who know the family).
- The parents have been arrested (for any reason) and there is no one to care adequately for the child.
- The child was exposed to the manufacturing or attempted manufacturing of a controlled substance.

In any of these cases, the younger the child, the greater the presumable need for protective custody.

Appendix C

CONDITIONS SUGGESTING THE NEED FOR AN ARREST OR THE ISUANCE OF A SUMMONS AND COMPLAINT

Subject to the provision of state law and the existence of probable cause to believe that a crime was committed and that it was committed by the suspect, the following situations suggest the need to arrest or issue a summons and complaint to the parent or other suspected perpetrator for the maltreatment:

- When needed to initiate a criminal prosecution.
- When a criminal prosecution seems likely (especially if there is reason to believe that the suspect will flee).
- When the arrest of the suspect is the only way to reasonably ensure the child's safety.
- When the arrest of the suspect will sufficiently protect the child so the child need not be removed from the home.
- When an arrest or the issuance of a summons and complaint may assist in the interview of the suspect.
- When the suspect's arrest or the issuance of a summons and complaint is necessary to preserve the peace.

Note: For the purposes of the chart, arrest includes any time that an individual is placed in police custody, whether or not a criminal prosecution has been decided upon. Furthermore, in some circumstances, arrests are made when there was no initial intention to do so. For example, a parent may be arrested for resisting efforts to gain entrance the home to assess the child's situation.

Appendix D

LANGUAGE AND CRITERIA FOR IDENTIFICATION OF SUSPECTED ABUSE

This section is intended to ensure that all parties are using the same language and criteria for identification of suspected abuse and neglect cases.

ABUSE

- Minor Excessive or inappropriate force used resulting in a superficial injury.
- Medium Excessive or inappropriate force used resulting in an injury which may require medical attention.
- Severe- Excessive or inappropriate force used resulting in a serious injury which requires medical attention and/or hospitalization.
- Near fatal Involves an incident in which a physician determines that a child is in serious, critical, or life-threatening condition as the result of sickness or injury caused by suspected abuse and/or neglect.
- Fatal Physical or emotional needs of a child are not met resulting in death.

NEGLECT

- Minor Physical or emotional needs of child are marginally or inconsistently met, but little or no impact on the child's functioning.
- Medium Physical or emotional needs of a child are inadequately met resulting in some impairment in the child's functioning.
- Severe Physical or emotional needs of a child are not met resulting in serious injury or illness.
- Near fatal Physical or emotional needs of the child are not met in an incident in which a
 physician determines that a child is in serious, critical, or life-threatening condition as the
 result of sickness or injury caused by suspected abuse and/or neglect.
- Fatal Physical or emotional needs of a child are not met resulting in death.

SEXUAL ABUSE

 Severity of sexual abuse should be determined based upon the type of contact, duration of contact, and the emotional impact upon the child.

- **SUBJECT:** Prowers County Adult Protective Services (APS) Cooperative Agreement for investigation of reports involving possible mistreatment of at-risk adults.
- II. **PURPOSE**: To clarify the coordinated duties and responsibilities of agencies involved in reporting, responding, and investigating reports regarding the abuse, caretaker neglect, and exploitation (mistreatment) of at-risk adults.
- III. **TERM OF AGREEMENT**: This Agreement will commence upon the date of the first signature and will be in effect for no more than five (5) years. Changes in the Agreement may be made in writing at any time by mutual consent of the County Department (herein referred to as APS) and *Prowers County Sheriff's Department, Lamar Police Department, Granada Police Department, and 15th Judicial District* (herein referred to as the law enforcement agency (LEA). Nothing in this Agreement shall substitute or represent a change in either agency's legally mandated responsibilities.

IV. BACKGROUND AND BASIS FOR THE AGREEMENT:

Per Section 26-3.1-103(2), each county department, law enforcement agency, district attorney's office, and other agency responsible under federal law or the laws of this state to investigate mistreatment of at-risk adults shall develop and implement cooperative agreements to coordinate the investigative duties of such agencies. The focus of such agreement shall be to ensure the best protection for at-risk adults. The agreements shall provide for special requests by one agency for assistance from another agency and for joint investigations. The agreements shall further provide that each agency shall maintain the confidentiality of the information exchanged pursuant to such joint investigations.

V. PRINCIPLES OF THE AGREEMENT

In accordance with the above-cited statute, this agreement is made to ensure coordinated response during all hours, provide for special requests for assistance from one agency to another, and arrange for joint investigation(s) when needed to maximize the effectiveness of the civil and criminal investigative processes.

It is understood that joint investigations may be used as a means to coordinate the efforts of the involved agencies, and that each individual agency remains accountable to its own rules, policies, and statutes.

It is understood that all agencies involved in this agreement shall accept reports of known or suspected mistreatment or self-neglect of at-risk adults.

The agency receiving reports during non-business hours should email/call the reports to APS within 24 hours at 877-264-5431 or cholt@prowerscounty.net, hbrewer@prowerscounty.net, and rdamiani@prowerscounty.net

VI. BUSINESS AND NON-BUSINESS HOUR PROCESSES

APS is required by program rule to have an established process to receive reports during business and non-business hours.

Prowers County APS receives reports made through the State Hotline during normal business hours and during non-business hours. The number to report APS mistreatment is 877-264-5431

APS receives reports during business hours at 877-264-5431. Business hours are Monday through Friday 8-5 p.m.

VII. DISPOSITION OF REPORTS

A copy of all reports of mistreatment made to APS shall be forwarded to the appropriate LEA within twenty four hours of receipt of the report. Per statute (§26-3.1-102(3), LEAs will not be provided reports that are alleging only self-neglect. A copy of all reports of mistreatment and self-neglect made to the LEA and the district attorney's office shall be forwarded to APS within one business day of receipt of the report. When mistreatment is identified by APS after the original report was shared with the LEA, APS must immediately make a report of the newly identified mistreatment to the appropriate *LEA*, as required by §18-6.5-108(1), C.R.S.

Reports of mistreatment of at-risk elders, 70 years of age or older, or an at-risk adult with an intellectual and developmental disability (at-risk adult with IDD), will be reviewed and evaluated by APS to determine if the at-risk elder or at-risk adult with IDD meets the statutory requirements of an at-risk adult pursuant to §26-3.1-101, C.R.S. before the report is screened in for investigation and provision of services.

The report shall include:

- name
- age or birth date of the at-risk-adult
- address of the at-risk adult

- name and address of the at-risk adult's caretaker, if any
- suspected nature and extent of the at-risk adult's injury, if any
- the nature and extent of the condition that will reasonably result in mistreatment or selfneglect;
- other pertinent information.

Reports involving criminal allegations of mistreatment, including caretaker neglect shall be immediately referred to local law enforcement. When criminal allegations are not initially apparent, the caseworker shall refer to the appropriate law enforcement agency having jurisdiction as soon as there are reasonable suspicions that a crime has been committed.

- Reports of abuse,
- caretaker neglect,
- exploitation of at-risk elders, 70 years of age or older, must be reported to law enforcement.

Law enforcement will forward all reports of abuse, caretaker neglect, or exploitation of at-risk elders to APS within 24 hours. APS will review and evaluate each report to determine if the at-risk elder meets the statutory requirements of an at-risk adult pursuant to C.R.S. 26-3.1-101 before protective services are rendered.

If a report is made to APS and it is later discovered that the person is 70 years of age or older, APS will notify law enforcement immediately. These are cases when the reporting party is not aware of the adult's age and makes the report to APS.

The report shall include: name, age, and address of the at-risk elder; the name and address of the at-risk elder's caretaker, if any; the suspected nature and extent of the at-risk elder's injury, if any; the nature and extent of the condition that will reasonably result in abuse, caretaker neglect, and/or exploitation; and other pertinent information.

VIII. AGENCY ROLES

APS is responsible for investigating reports of suspected mistreatment and/or self-neglect of at-risk adults.

The County Attorney's Office is responsible for reviewing reports of mistreatment of at-risk adults when a review is requested, when APS is considering filing for legal authority of an at-risk adult, and when an investigation involves complaints of alleged criminal activity.

LEAs are primarily responsible for the coordination and investigation of criminal allegations involving at-risk adults, at-risk elders, and at-risk adults with an IDD.

The District Attorney's Office is responsible for reviewing reports of criminal actions or threats of mistreatment of at-risk adults, at-risk elders, and at-risk adults with an IDD to determine possibility of prosecution.

IX. INVESTIGATION PROCEDURE AND GUIDELINES

APS and LEAs have different legal requirements related to investigations that must be followed. The agencies agree to the following considerations when investigating either jointly or independently.

Any agency that is a partner in this cooperative agreement may request stand-by assistance from another agency. (For example, in situations where an APS worker's safety may be in question or where the LEA needs assistance with a client with dementia.)

APS may request LEA assistance to gain access to conduct an investigation as outlined in §26-3.1-103(1.3), C.R.S.

While APS may accommodate a request by law enforcement to temporarily delay an investigation or an interview, APS will only delay until the (30th) day following the date of the report.

APS may jointly investigate reports with law enforcement when the adult is "at-risk" by APS statutory definition and there is mistreatment. APS cannot jointly investigate if these criteria are not met. Either APS or the LEA may request a joint investigation.

When a joint investigation is required, the APS caseworker, law enforcement officer(s), and/or the District Attorney's Office may conduct joint interviews, compare notes, and clarify information following interviews. Information may be shared, as outlined in the Confidentiality section, below.

LEAs will share information, such as police reports and summaries of evidence, as requested by APS whether investigating independently or jointly. APS will share information and evidence that they collect during an investigation, whether independent or joint, when sharing that information is allowed by statute (§26-3.1-102(7), C.R.S.), outlined in Section X, Confidentiality.

The LEA shall be considered the lead agency in criminal joint investigations. APS shall be considered the lead agency in non-criminal joint investigations.

Intellectual and developmental disability investigators, ombudsmen, or other agencies with legal authority to investigate mistreatment may be present as part of the joint investigative team.

When joint investigation is required, contact law enforcement by contacting the local law enforcement agency with appropriate jurisdiction, contact APS by calling Prowers County Department of Human Services during normal business hours, or dispatch for the on-call worker after hours, and contact the District Attorney's Office.

Joint investigation may be utilized when the following pertain to an at-risk adult:

1. There is pain and/or physical injury, as demonstrated by, but not limited to, substantial or multiple skin bruising, bleeding, malnutrition, dehydration, burns, bone fractures, poisoning, subdural hematoma, soft tissue swelling or suffocation.

- 2. Unreasonable confinement or restraint has been imposed.
- 3. There is nonconsensual sexual conduct or contact classified as a crime under Colorado law.
- 4. Caretaker neglect threatens the at-risk adult's safety or well-being.
- 5. Exploitation has occurred and/or is occurring and the exploitation is a crime under Colorado law.
- 6. Threats of violence, presence of firearms, intoxication, or any illegal activity is present and threatens the at-risk adult or APS caseworker's safety.
- 7. Specialized interviewing skills might be required.

X. CONFIDENTIALITY

APS report, investigative, and case information is confidential and may only be shared without a court order under very specific exceptions, as outlined in §26-3.1-103(2), C.R.S. This report, investigative, and case information includes, but is not limited to the name and address of the atrisk adult, members of the adult's family, reporting party's name and address, findings on the alleged perpetrator, and any other information or evidence obtained in the report or during the investigation and subsequent casework related to the report.

Exceptions to the requirement of a court order for sharing information that are most relevant to this agreement include:

- §26-3.1-102(7)(b)(III), C.R.S. Sharing information during a joint investigation. APS can share
 information and evidence collected throughout the investigation, including the finding on
 the alleged perpetrator(s) only when the LEA is actively investigating with APS.
- Sharing information in order to provide services to an at-risk adult, such as when a protective order may be necessary.
- §26-3.1-102(7)(b)(I), C.R.S. When a criminal investigation into an allegation of mistreatment is being conducted and APS report and case information is relevant to the investigation.
- §26-3.1-102(7)(b)(I), C.R.S. When a criminal complaint, information, or indictment is filed and APS report and case information is relevant to the investigation.
- §26-3.1-102(7)(b)(I), C.R.S. When a review of death by a coroner is being conducted when the death is suspected to be related to mistreatment and APS report and case information is relevant to the investigation.
- §26-3.1-102(7)(b)(II), C.R.S. When there is a death of a suspected at-risk adult from mistreatment or self-neglect and a LEA files a formal charge or a grand jury issues an indictment in connection with the death.

Unless necessary for filing criminal charges and/or for court proceedings the identity of the reporting party should not be disclosed to other parties by either APS or the LEA.

XI. Termination

This agreement is valid until October ______,2028.

Any party wishing to terminate this agreement shall do so in writing to all parties with a thirty (30) day notice.

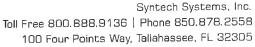

Financial obligations of the City payable after the current fiscal year are contingent upon funds for that purpose being appropriated, budgeted, and otherwise made available in accordance with the rules, regulations, and resolutions of City of Lamar, and other applicable law. Upon the failure to appropriate such funds, this Agreement shall be terminated.

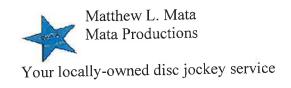

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS PURCHASE AGREEMENT is entered into by and the CITY OF LAMAR, a Colorado Home Rule Municipality, whose address is 102 E Parmenter St, Lamar, CO 81052, hereinafter referred to as between hereinafter referred to as "Seller", and MELISSA J. BOWER, whose address is 2877 County Road MM Wiley, CO 81092, hereinafter referred to as "Buyer".

WITNESSETH:

That for and in consideration of the mutual promises set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration, the Parties covenant and agree as follows, to-wit:

SECTION ONE PROPERTY SOLD; PRICE; PAYMENT

That Seller shall sell to Buyer and Buyer shall purchase from Seller the following described real property situated in the County of Prowers and State of Colorado based on a land survey dated conducted by the City, to-wit:

The North 100 feet of the West 140 feet of Block "H" in Holmes and Parmenter's Addition to the Town (now City) of Lamar, According to the recorded plat thereof, County of Prowers, State of Colorado

Better known as: 1101 S Main Street Lamar, CO 81052

(the "*Property*")

Buyer shall pay Seller a total purchase price of Ninety Thousand and no/100 Dollars (\$90,000.00) Payable as follows, to wit:

- a. Upon execution of this purchase agreement between both parties, Buyer shall pay as Escrow, the sum of Nine Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$9,000.00) which shall constitute good and sufficient earnest monies and shall be paid and held in the Guaranty Abstract Trust Account and shall be applied to the purchase price at closing.
- b. Upon closing, the total sum of Eighty-One Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$81,000.00) shall be paid to Seller in cash or certified funds.

SECTION TWO TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS

Taxes, assessments, and property insurance premiums for the year 2022 and all previous years that the Property has been owned by the Seller as a municipality shall be abated for the Seller. Taxes and assessments for the year 2023, as based upon the 2022 tax assessment, shall be prorated between the Parties to date of possession with the Seller, as a municipality, having taxes abated up to the date of possession and Buyer paying from the date of possession thereafter.

SECTION THREE TITLE INSURANCE

Seller at its own cost and expense shall purchase a title insurance commitment certificate to a date no earlier than the date of said Purchase Agreement showing good and merchantable title in fee simple, free and clear of all liens and encumbrances except for any and all oil, gas and other mineral reservations of record, existing easements or rights of way for roads, pipelines, telephone and electric lines and other utilities, and to the burdens of special districts and similar restrictions, and as to taxes assessed for the year 2023 and subsequent years. Said title insurance commitment will be ordered from Title Company of Buyer's choosing after execution of said Agreement.

SECTION FOUR TITLE EXAMINATION

Buyer shall have a reasonable time in which to examine said title commitment or abstract of title and to notify Seller of any title defects or requirements. If no notice of such defects is received within ten (10) days, then the title shall be deemed merchantable. Notice of any reasonable title requirements to be made shall be given in writing by Buyer to Seller, and Seller shall have a reasonable time to cure the same, not to exceed thirty (30) days. However, if such title requirements cannot be cured before the Closing or within a reasonable period of time, Buyer may elect to accept such title as Seller may convey or to otherwise terminate this Agreement without damages to either party. Alternatively, the Parties may continue the Closing in order for Seller to do so, in which event Seller shall pay all necessary expenses in connection with curing any reasonable title requirements.

SECTION FIVE INCLUSIONS; EXCLUSIONS; RESERVATIONS

That included in said conveyance is fencing and any improvements on the property. All of which are being sold to Buyer from Seller without warranty or representation in an "as is" condition. Prior to Closing, Seller will remove from the premises all personal property unless included.

SECTION SIX "AS IS" PURCHASE

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, Buyer specifically acknowledges that Buyer is purchasing the Property in its "AS IS", condition and further acknowledges and agrees that, except as expressly contained in this Purchase Agreement, neither Seller nor anyone acting for or on behalf of Seller has made any representations, statements, warranties, or promises to Buyer concerning the physical aspects and conditions of any of the improvements upon the aforementioned real property, the availability of changes in zoning or permitted uses, the availability of water for irrigation or otherwise for any of the Property, any dimensions or specifications of any of the Property, the acreage of the Property, the feasibility or desirability of any of the Property for a particular use, any projected income or expenses for any of the Property.

Buyer is purchasing the aforementioned real property after being afforded a right to inspection and examination, in an "AS IS" state of repair, Buyer does hereby waive and Seller does hereby disclaim all warranties of any type or kind whatsoever with respect to the Property except as expressly contained in this Agreement or in the Special Warranty Deed to be provided at closing, express or implied, including by way of description but not limitation, those of fitness for a particular purpose, habitability, environmental or hazardous materials and use.

SECTION SEVEN CLOSING DATE/POSSESSION

This Purchase Agreement shall be closed at a time mutually convenient to both parties on or before October 31, 2023. At closing Seller shall execute a Special Warranty Deed, and other documents that will be required to fully effectuate the intent of this Agreement and transfer the aforementioned real property and Buyer concurrently shall deliver the purchase price and other documents as it may be reasonably necessary to Seller to effectuate the intent of this Agreement. Costs of closing charged will be paid split equally between the Buyer and Seller. Buyer will be entitled to possession at closing.

SECTION EIGHT BREACH BY BUYER

If Buyer is in default, Seller may elect to treat this contract as terminated, in which case all payments and things of value received hereunder shall be forfeited to Seller and Seller may recover such damages as may be proper, or Seller may elect to treat this contract as being in full force and effect and Seller shall have the right to an action for specific performance or damages, or both.

SECTION NINE BREACH BY SELLER

If Seller is in default, Buyer may elect to treat this contract as terminated, in which case all payments and things of value received hereunder shall be returned to Buyer and Buyer may recover such damages as may be proper, or Buyer may elect to treat this contract as being in full force and effect and Buyer shall have the right to an action for specific performance or damages, or both.

SECTION TEN DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

In the event the Property is damaged by fire or casualty prior to closing, the Buyer may elect that the insurance proceeds be used to repair or restore the Property and this Purchase Agreement shall continue, unless the damages exceed the purchase price under this Agreement, in which event, this Agreement may be terminated at the option of the Buyer and all payments and things of value received hereunder shall be returned to Buyer. Should Buyer elect to carry out this contract despite such damage, Buyer shall be entitled to all the credit for the insurance proceeds resulting from such damage, not exceeding, however, the total purchase price.

SECTION ELEVEN

AGREEMENT NOT OPTION

The Parties agree that this Agreement is for the purchase and sale of the aforementioned Real Property as herein described and that it is in no wise to be deemed or construed as an option and shall be and become binding, except as provided herein, to the parties hereto, their personal representatives, heirs, successors and assigns and shall not be amended or altered unless in writing signed by all Parties.

SECTION TWELVE ATTORNEY FEES

In addition to all remedies provided for by law in the event of any dispute regarding the terms or enforcement to any provision in this Purchase Agreement, the successful party shall be awarded its costs and reasonable attorney's fees against the unsuccessful party, including those fees and costs incurred in any arbitration, litigation or appeal of such dispute.

SECTION THIRTEEN SURVEYS, INSPECTIONS AND COSTS

The Parties acknowledge that an additional survey may be required for a more accurate description, which Buyer shall be responsible for the cost of said survey. In the event Buyer desires any inspections, such costs shall be Buyer's sole responsibility and expense. Buyer shall be responsible for the payment of all costs relating to any survey or other inspection incurred by Buyer. Buyer shall notify the Seller of any defects resulting from any survey or inspection, and Seller shall have a reasonable period of time to cure any defects. However, if the defect is not or cannot be cured within a reasonable period of time, then Buyer may elect to accept such title as Seller may convey or to otherwise terminate this Agreement without damages to either party. Alternatively, the Parties may continue the Closing in order to do so.

SECTION FOURTEEN ASSIGNMENT OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall not be assignable by Buyer without Seller's prior written consent. Except as so restricted, this Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and be binding upon the heirs, personal representatives, successors and assigns of the Parties.

SECTION FIFTEEN COUNSEL

Buyer acknowledges that the firm of Steerman Law Offices represents Seller in this transaction. Buyer has been fully advised to consult with independent legal counsel and tax advisors concerning the terms and conditions of this Agreement, as well as the advisability of entering into and executing this Agreement and are fully informed as to its contents.

SECTION SIXTEEN

Time is of the essence of this Purchase Agreement.

SECTION SEVENTEEN SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Purchase Agreement is held to be illegal, unenforceable or invalid, such provision(s) shall be severed and the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION EIGHTEEN GOVERNING LAWS

This Purchase Agreement will be subject to the laws of the State of Colorado and jurisdiction for any action of breach or interpretation will be with the appropriate county or district court for Prowers County, Colorado. Nothing contained in this Agreement should be construed of the Seller being a governmental entity within the State of Colorado waiving any privilege or governmental immunity it may have under the laws of the United States and State of Colorado.

SECTION NINETEEN COUNTERPARTS

This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. 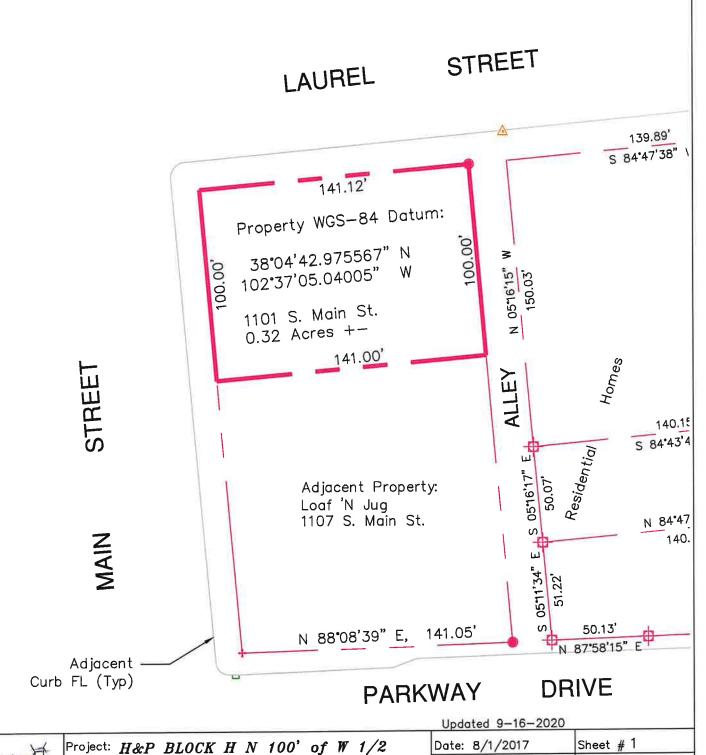

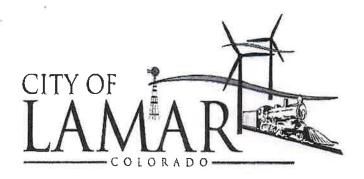

BACKGROUND:

On Friday, October 6, the membership of Colorado Counties, Inc. (CCI) voted to oppose proposition HH, a measure on the upcoming November ballot. CCI represents 61 of the 64 counties in Colorado.

If approved by voters, this measure would greatly impact the 2024 budgets for county governments as they rely largely and sometimes solely on property taxes as their revenue source.

As residents of Prowers County, Lamar's constituents demand improvements to transportation, housing, public safety, and other services," said CCI President Steve O'Dorisio, Adams County Commissioner. "Majority of CCI's members are concerned that Prop HH could reduce local governments' ability to respond to these public expectations, unfunded mandates, and additional regulatory requirements."

If Proposition HH were to pass it would mandate reductions in local property taxes for at least 10 years, resulting in billions of dollars of lost revenue for county governments without any reduction in service obligations.

2024 incoming CCI President, Delta County Commissioner Don Suppes said, "Prop HH will have a long-term negative effect on TABOR with a minimal short-term benefit."

Prowers County commissioners have requested that the City of Lamar show support by passing a resolution that is in opposition to Proposition HH.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the resolution as presented

RESOLUTION NUMBER 23-10-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF LAMAR, COLORADO OPPOSING PROPOSITION HH, AN UNDUE LIMITATION ON MUNICIPAL BUDGETS AND LOCAL CONTROL OF PROPERTY TAX RELIEF

WHEREAS, the City of Lamar is aware of the financial burden that increased property tax valuations may create and desires to provide locally-appropriate relief without negatively impacting its ability to provide needed services and programs;

WHEREAS, the City of Lamar relies on property tax revenue to offset general fund operating and for street repairs and maintenance.

WHEREAS, the City of Lamar annually prepares a budget and certifies a property tax mill levy through an open and public process under existing law;

WHEREAS, by Senate Bill 23-303, the Colorado General Assembly referred to voters Proposition "HH" that, among other things, would:

- lower property taxes compared to what would be owed under current law by temporarily lowering the assessment rates for residential and certain types of non-residential property, applying value reductions for certain types of residential properties, and by creating new property tax exemptions;
- impose an unnecessary and arbitrary limit on the growth of property tax revenue for certain local governments (excluding school districts and home rule local governments) unless the governing body votes to exceed the limit after a public hearing and does not provide any opportunity for reimbursement of revenues lost due to the limit;
- permit the state to retain money that would be otherwise refunded to taxpayers under the Taxpayer's Bill of Rights to be used for education, partial reimbursements to local governments for reduced property tax revenue, and rental assistance programs;

WHEREAS, after factoring in partial reimbursements of lost revenue, Proposition HH is estimated to decrease revenue to local governments statewide, on net, by at least \$100 million in 2024, \$350 million in 2025, and \$550 million in 2026, and is estimated to reduce the property tax revenue of the City of Lamar by 32% for 2024 and down respectively for the next two years.

WHEREAS, Proposition HH would unnecessarily constrain the ability of the City Council to control its budget and to provide locally-appropriate property tax relief;

WHEREAS, the long-term fiscal impact of Proposition HH on the City of Lamar and other local governments that serve our community is unclear and will cause uncertainty in our budgeting process;

WHEREAS, the complexity of Proposition HH will impose unnecessary administrative burdens on the City of Lamar.

<u>BACKGROUND</u>: On November 8, 2022, Colorado voters approved Proposition 123, the Dedicate State Income Tax Revenue to Fund Housing Projects Initiative. In turn, it has created the State Affordable Housing Fund, which dedicates 40% of its funds to the Affordable Housing *Support* Fund and 60% to the Affordable Housing Financing Fund. To qualify for access to these funds, the City of Lamar must complete a Local Government Affordable Housing Commitment form by November 1, 2023. A City of Lamar Resolution is required to confirm the City's intention to access these funds and create an expedited review process for Affordable housing developments.

With the assistance of a Department of Local Affairs (DOLA) Planning Grant, Southeastern Enterprise Development, Inc. (SECED) has been working with the six Southeastern Colorado counties to complete zoning code updates and increase affordable housing stock through a regional housing authority. Within the regional housing authority's plan is that Lamar increase total affordable housing by 87 units. See the accompanying memo for a summary of its progress and plans.

If the City of Lamar chooses not to Proposition 123, the City of Lamar will be unable collaborate in the effort to utilize Prop 123 funds to build additional affordable housing units in Lamar.

RECOMMENDATION: Approve Resolution to "Opt in" for Proposition 123-created funding and authorize the Mayor to sign.

RESOLUTION NO. 23-10-03

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMAR, COLORADO, OPTING INTO PROPOSITION 123

WHEREAS, the voters of Colorado approved Proposition 123 in 2022 creating the State Affordable Housing Fund to make certain funds available to local governments as defined by CRS-29-32-104; and

WHEREAS, the Proposition allows local governments to opt-in to this program by November 1, 2023 by declaring a three-year commitment, allowing the City to be eligible for this funding; and

WHEREAS, the City of Lamar, Colorado is a Home Rule municipality duly and regularly organized and validly existing as a body corporate and politic under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of the State of Colorado and is eligible for Proposition 123 funding and programing; and

WHEREAS, the City Council authorizes the City staff to opt-in and set a baseline for the development of affordable housing as defined Proposition 123; and

WHEREAS, with technical funding assistance from the Colorado Department of Local Affairs, the City Council hereby directs the Planning and Zoning Commission to consider Zoning code to amendments and bring recommendations back to the City Council on the "Qualified Strategy" for "fast track review" for affordable housing applications and other incentives to comply with Proposition 123.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LAMAR, COLORADO, that:

- Section 1. The City Council of the City of Lamar hereby elects to opt-in to Proposition 123 with the three-year goal to increase the City's affordable housing to increase affordable housing by 3% each year over the baseline number within its territorial boundaries, as established by the process set forth in the statute.
- <u>Section 2</u>. The City Administrator, or designee, will file the City's commitment with the State Division of Housing and will create and implement a process to expedite the development approval for affordable housing projects, as defined in the statute.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The City Administrator, or designee, will report the City's compliance to the City Council through annual reports, and report compliance to the State Administrator of this program through the process defined in the statute.

SUBJECT: DOLA Grant Update

Background:

SECED received a DOLA Planning Grant to assist the six-county region with housing and zoning code updates. The DOLA IHOP grant offers Counties and Municipalities across the six-county region the opportunity to update zoning codes that incentivize housing development through the adoption of "Qualified Strategies". The strategies that the communities are looking at fall into the following categories:

- 1. Expedited review for affordable housing projects
- 2. Sustainable funding source for housing and reduction of development fees
- 3. Land banking, donation policies, and use of publicly controlled property for housing
- 4. Creation of a Regional Housing Authority
- Processes to address blighted property for housing

This grant is assisting local communities formally adopt one or more of these Qualified Strategies by Resolution or Ordinance.

Regional Housing Authority:

The SECED board is moving forward with the potential creation of a six-county Multijurisdictional Regional Housing Authority (RHA). This is a quasi-governmental entity that will be able to leverage funds collaboratively across the region. The RHA is being formed by the six counties BOCC and will geographically allow all residents and municipalities within the boundary to participate. This is being formed at the county level to ensure local municipalities can bring forward projects for funding or other development assistance without placing local elected municipal leaders or planning commissioners in a position that could possibly jeopardize their quasi-juridical authority of reviewing a development within their jurisdiction. The RHA also ensures through its legal IGA creation that our local municipal governments retain their land use authority on reviewing housing development applications.

The RHA will use SECED to be the managing agency to oversee the finances and complete a yearly audit as required by law. A Housing Development Director is proposed to be hired to work with the local municipalities and local Housing Authorities to facilitate the development of housing. The RHA is envisioned to be a resource to assist our communities with creating public/private partnerships that make development and financing future housing projects possible. Focus areas are proposed to be continued regional collaboration, land banking, technical assistance, grant writing, and leveraging regional funding. This entity is intended to steward the public funds generated by the High Plains Home builds, and bring in new resources that can be used across the region. It is not intended to duplicate or replace any existing housing agencies.

Proposition 123 Update:

Prop 123 passed in 2022 and created the State's Affordable Housing Fund with an additional \$160M in FY22-23 and \$318M in FY23-24 for affordable home ownership, land banking, equity programs, planning, programs serving homelessness, and concessionary debt programs. Local governments that want access to these funds will have <u>until November 1, 2023</u>, to opt into Prop 123 by filing a local government commitment to building affordable housing. The state has not created a formal policy on how local governments are required to opt in beyond registering through a state online portal by following this link:

Our team is working on setting up a zoom to assist your staff in filling out this application, which takes about 15 minutes. More details on this zoom will be sent out in the next few weeks. The following link provides the baseline numbers and additional housing needed to meet Prop 123 requirements:

The consultant team is recommending at a minimum a voice vote "opting into Prop 123" is conducted and recorded into your official meeting minutes. By "opting in" your community will be eligible to access funding from the State Affordable Housing Fund. Opting in is committing your municipality or County to increase your affordable housing stock by 3% a year or 9% over the next three years. The penalty for not achieving this metric by the State is minimal: your community would be ineligible for funding for a 1-year period starting in 2027. There is no claw back of funding that was awarded or other penalties.

If Counties or municipalities opt into Prop 123, they are required to have passed policies by resolution or codified zoning codes that included expedited review (or fasted track review) processes for affordable housing land development applications by 2026. Our team is recommending that any County or municipality wishing to have access to Prop 123 engage in the adoption of expedited review polices or codes to ensure compliance. This is also a "Qualified Strategy" as defined by DOLA and our assistance is covered by the Grant. Michael is working on template documents and providing assistance in getting these adopted, see below.

Communities with Zoning or Land Use Codes:

This portion of the memo applies to Counties and municipalities with zoning. Our team is recommending that any communities wishing to access the State's Affordable Housing fund by opting into Prop 123 amend their zoning or land use code to include Expedited Review or fast track review for affordable housing. This amendment is not highly likely to materially affect your community's review process because there is not a backlog of development applications waiting to be reviewed by your community's planning commissions, councils, trustees, or BOCCs. However, the codification of this amendment will be required by Prop 123. There are two essential parts of the language to be inserted in your current code.

First if your code has definitions, Affordable Housing as defined by Prop 123 should be inserted as follows: AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNIT - means a dwelling unit which is available for rental or purchase on terms that would be affordable to households earning sixty (60%) percent or less of the median income for rentals or earning one hundred (100%) percent or less of the area median income (AMI) for ownership of County residents, as adjusted for family size and no more than 30% of the total household income goes towards housing costs.

The second amendment should be inserted into your zoning permit or special review process section of your code is similar form as follows:

Projects containing Affordable Housing shall be fast tracked by being scheduled for the next available public hearing, if required, within 90 days of a complete application and proper public noticing being completed. A

final decision on the application shall be rendered within 90 days unless an extension is requested by the applicant.

Our team recognizes each code is unique and will require language drafted by your community's legal counsel. We are working collectively across the region to assist in the drafting of these documents to get these updates in our communities' codes to ensure access to the State's Affordable Housing Fund. Some municipalities may also require their Planning Commission to review the code amendment. Michael is working with your staff and legal counsel as we endeavor to get all 28 SECED eligible for this funding source.

Communities without Zoning:

Our team has prepared a draft Resolution for communities without a zoning or land use code. The attached Resolution formally "opts in" your community, creates an expediated review policy for affordable housing, and also designates the future Regional Housing Authority to assist with your community with accessing the Prop 123 funding. The attached Resolution is included for your review and possible approval.

BACKGROUND:

Anthony Aguilera has brought in an application for the vacating of an alley that runs along his property at 401 S. 14th St, Lamar, Colorado. The alley has not been used as such for over thirty years. Proper application has been made to the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Lamar, Colorado to vacate the East-West alley between lots 1 and 2, block 4 in Maxwell's addition and Block L in west side addition, according to the recorded plats thereof, City of Lamar, County of Prowers, State of Colorado. The Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on the application, pursuant to proper, timely and legally sufficient public notice, posting, and publication. Planning and Zoning recommends that the City of Lamar vacate the alley.

3. The City Clerk and the GIS office are hereby directed to make all necessary changes on the official map of the City of Lamar in respect to the above and foregoing ordinance.

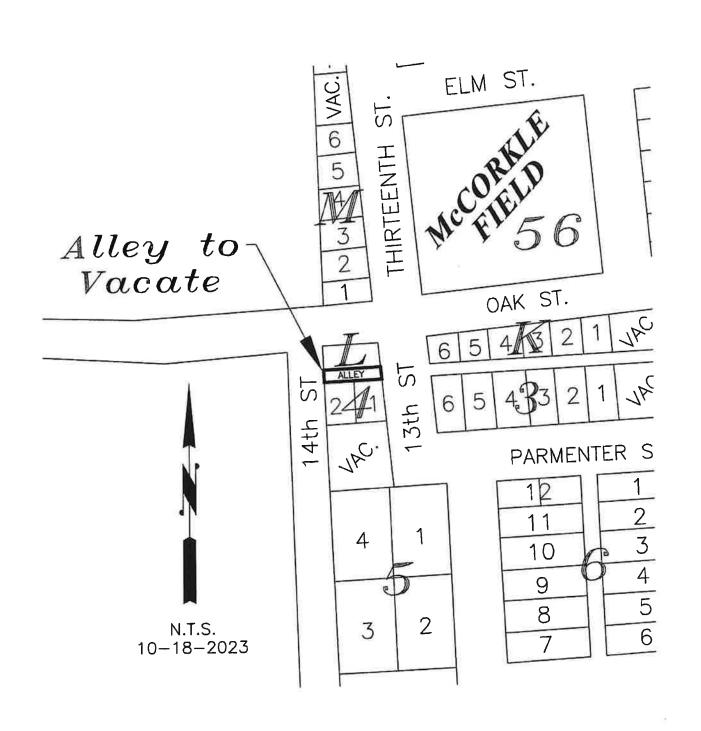
